The organisers of the International Conference "*Perspectives and Approaches in Historical Research*" are pleased to inform you that the papers presented in the sections of the conference, between 23 and 24 September 2022 will be published in a volume at Editura Universității din București (Bucharest University Press, ranked B by the National Council of Scientific Research).

The volume aims to illustrate the thematic diversity and the variety of approaches and methodologies used by the doctoral students in their research.

Deadline to submit the articles is November 30, 2022

When the paper is submitted, it should be accompanied by a written agreement of the doctoral coordinator for the publication of the submitted article (email confirmation) and a brief note on the author (2-3 lines including institutional affiliation, official email address, and the name of the doctoral coordinator).

The papers will be double-blind peer-reviewed. The author will have a limited time to implement the suggestions for improvement.

Style Guidelines

The length of the articles must be between **25 000 to 50 000 characters** (spaces and references included).

Page size (A4):

- Page height: 29,7cm
- Page width: 21cm

The texts should be written in **English**. For writing, please use:

Title:

- Font: Times New Roman
- Size: 14
- The space between rows: 1.5p.
- Capital letters
- Aligned in the Center (CTRL+E)

Author name

- Font: Times New Roman
- Size: 13
- The space between rows: 1.5p.
- Capital letters
- Aligned Right (CTRL+R)

Text and Bibliography

- Font: Times New Roman
- Size: 12
- The space between rows: 1p.
- Please remove the space after paragraphs
- Aligned Justify (CTRL+J)
- The pages should not be numbered.

References citation

The article should be written using Chicago citation system, without footnotes. References are cited in text and in bibliography as follow:

Books with one author

In text: (Last name of the author, year of publication, page)

In bibliography: Last name of the author, first name of the author. Year of publication. *Title (with italics)*. Place of publication: Publishing House.

Ex.:

In text: (Cameron, 2020, 78)

In bibliography: Cameron, Averil. 2020. *Bizantinii*. București: Polirom

Books with two authors

In text: (Last name of author 1 and Last name of author 2, year of publication, page)

In bibliography: Last name of author 1, first name of author 1 and last name of author 2, first name of author 2. Year of publication. *Title (with italics)*. Place of publication: Publishing House.

Ex.:

In text: (Lung and Zbucea, 2007, 29)

In bibliography: Lung, Ecaterina and Zbucea, Gheorghe. 2007. *Structuri etno-politice și economico-sociale în evul mediu. Europa Medievală (secolele V-XV)*. București: Editura Fundației România de Măine

Books with three or more authors

In text: (Last name of author 1 et al., year of publication, page)

In bibliography: Last name of author 1, first name of author 1, last name of author 2, first name of author 2, and so on. Year of publication. *Title (with italics)*. Place of publication: Publishing House.

Ex.:

In text: (Laumann et al, 1994, 262)

In bibliography: Laumann, Edward O., John H. Gagnon, Robert T. Michael, and Stuart Michaels. 1994. *The social organization of sexuality: Sexual practices in the United States*. Chicago: University of Chicago Press.

Editor, translator, or compiler instead of author

In text: (Last name of translator/editor/compiler, year of publication, page)

In bibliography: Last name of translator/editor/compiler, first name of author translator/editor/compiler, trans./ed. Year of publication. *Title (with italics)*. Place of publication: Publishing House.

Ex.:

In text: (Lattimore, 1951, 103)

In bibliography: Lattimore, Richmond, trans. 1951, *The Iliad of Homer*. Chicago: University of Chicago Press

Chapter, essay or other part of a book

In text: (Last name of author, year of publication, page)

In bibliography: Last name of author, first name of author. Year of publication. Title of article/chapter (between quotation marks “”). In *Title of book (with italics)*, ed. First name of editor last name of editor, pages of the article, Place of publication: Publishing House.

Ex.:

In text: (Coman, 2016, 133)

In bibliography: Coman, Marian. 2016. “De ce este Valahia Femeie? (și ce caută pe hartă?)”. In *Povestiri întretăiate. Istoria în cheie minoră*, ed. Ovidiu Cristea, 117-154. Târgoviște: Cetatea de Scaun

Books published electronically

In text: (Last name of author, year of publication, page)

In bibliography: Last name of the author, first name of the author. Year of publication. *Title (with italics)*. Place of publication: Publishing House. link to site (the date when it was accessed)

Ex.:

In text: (Lurland and Lerner, 1987, 36)

In bibliography: Lurland, Philip B., and Ralph Lerner, eds. 1987. *The Founders' Constitution*. Chicago: University of Chicago Press. <http://press-pubs.uchicago.edu/founders/> (accessed September 22, 2019)

Collection of primary sources

In text: (abbreviated form of the title, year of publication, vol/tome/no., page)

In bibliography: Last name of the editor/translator, first name of the editor/translator, Year of publication. *Title (with italics)*. Vol/tome/no. Place of publication: Publishing House.

Ex.:

In text: (FHDR, 1982, III, 369)

In bibliography: Elian, Alexandru, Tanașoca, Nicolae-Șerban, 1982. *Fontes Historiae Daco-Romanae*. III. București: Editura Academiei Republicii Socialiste

Scholarly journals

In text: (Last name of author, year of publication, page)

In bibliography: Last name of the author, first name of the author. Year of publication. Title of article (between quotation marks “”). In *Title of journal (with italics)* number of journal: pages of article.

Ex.:

In text: (Adler, 1904, 98)

In bibliography: Adler, Marcus N. 1904. “The Itinerary of Benjamin of Tudela (Continued)”. In *The Jewish Quarterly Review* 4, 84-101

Newspaper article

In text: (Last name of author, year of publication)

In bibliography: Last name of the author, first name of the author. Year of publication. Title of article (between quotation marks “”). In *Title of newspaper (with italics)*, date when the newspaper was published

Ex.:

In text: (Nieder Korn, 2002)

In bibliography: Nieder Korn, William S. 2002. “A scholar recants on his Shakespeare discovery”. *New York Times*, June 20

Article in an online journal, magazine or newspaper

In text: (Last name of author, year of publication, page)

In bibliography: Last name of the author, first name of the author. Year of publication. Title of article (between quotation marks “”). In *Title of journal (with italics)*, number of journal, link of the article (the date when it was accessed)

Ex.:

In text: (Hlatky et al. 2002)

In bibliography: Hlatky, Mark A., Derek Boothroyd, Eric Vittinghoff, Penny Sharp, and Mary A. Whooley. 2002. "Quality-of-life and depressive symptoms in postmenopausal women after receiving hormone therapy: Results from the Heart and Estrogen/Progestin Replacement Study (HERS) trial". *Journal of the American Medical Association* 287, no. 5 (February 6), <http://jama.ama-assn.org/issues/v287n5/rfull/joc10108.html#aainfo> (accessed January 7, 2004).

Web sites

In text: (abbreviation of URL / short name of site)

In bibliography: abbreviation of URL / short name of site – as it was cited in text. link of the site (the date when it was accessed)

Ex.:

In text: (Evanston Public Library Board of Trustees)

In bibliography: Evanston Public Library Board of Trustees. <http://www.epl.org/library/strategic-plan-00.html> (accessed March 21, 2020)

Documents from National Archives or other institutions

In text: (abbreviation of the name of the institution. Name of folder. number of folio / page)

In bibliography: abbreviation of the name of the institution (as it was cited in text) – full name of the institution. Name of folder. Name of file.

Ex.:

In text: (AMSZRP. D-I-R-0-24/9/65. 12-19)

In bibliography: AMSZRP – Arhivele Ministerului Afacerilor Externe al Republicii Polone. D-I-R-0-24/9/65. Notă – congresul al IX-lea al Partidului Comunist Român

Movies

In text: (Last name of the director of the movie, the year the film was released, minute)

In bibliography: Last name of the director of the movie, first name of the director. the year the film was released: the name of the movie

Ex.:

In text: (Bostan, 1989, 29)

In bibliography: Bostan, Elisabeta. 1989: Desene pe asfalt

List of references (Bibliography)

The references should be arranged in alphabetical order, in categories (Books, Journals, Documents from archives, Web sites, etc.). If there are more than one reference from one author, references cited should be arranged chronologically. If there are more than one references for one author in the same year, use a, b, c, etc. The references to same or different authors should be separated by semicolon (Diaconu, 1970, 97; Diaconu, 1972, 88)

Include only references cited in the text, figures, captions and tables.

For titles in other languages than English, French, Italian, Spanish and German, please add the translation of the title between square brackets. Please transliterate the titles from languages which don't use the Latin alphabet.

Arrange the references alphabetically by first author and then alphabetically by second author. If there are more than one reference to the same author(s), arrange them chronologically. For references with more than two authors, list alphabetically by first author and then chronologically.

In bibliography, every reference cited in text should be linked by a bibliographical reference, as follows:

Books:

Cameron, 2020 - Cameron, Averil. 2020. *Bizantinii*. București: Polirom

Papers:

Adler, 1904 - Adler, Marcus N. 1904. "The Itinerary of Benjamin of Tudela (Continued)". In *The Jewish Quarterly Review* 4, 84-101

Chapters in books:

Coman, 2016 - Coman, Marian. 2016. "De ce este Valahia Femeie? (și ce caută pe hartă?)". In *Povestiri întretăiate. Istoria în cheie minoră*, ed. Ovidiu Cristea, 117-154. Târgoviște: Cetatea de Scaun

List of illustrations

The illustrations, images, graphs, tables cited in texts should be sent separately in email, being named as in the text. The legend should be added to the illustration number. Inside the text, each illustration (maps, graphs, images) should correspond to the number of the illustration list. Maps must indicate the North, have at least two coordinate data on each axis, and have a graphic scale. Localities mentioned in text, should be marked on maps.

For images, photos and maps, please send the agreement of the copyright owner for publishing.
